News from the School

The Finals of the U18 and U16 National Schools' Indoor Hockey

took place at Whitgift in January. The U16 team just failed to make the Semi-Finals, but the U18 team won the title for the third time in five years. The U18 team defeated Millfield in the Final on penalty flicks, after the teams were level 2-2 at full time.

A very wet first half of the Lent Term resulted in many rugby matches being cancelled, but the Nat West games went ahead. The 1st XV lost 6-11 to Hampton in Round 7; the U15s, however, have progressed to the Semi-finals after a hard fought win over Trent College, their next opponents will be QEGS, Wakefield. Henry Cheeseman (UVIth) made his Harlequins 1st XV debut in the LV Cup against Cardiff.

The members of the School fencing team have produced some very good results recently; at the Surrey Youth Fencing Championships seven gold medals were won by Ben Lindsay, Caleb Watson, Adam Dobson, Rudi Bruijn-Yard, Connor Head, Ian Head and Tarriq Roach. Tarriq also won gold in the U13 Leon Paul Junior Series. OWs Dudley Tredger (epee), Greg Allen (epee) and Maiyuran Ratneswaran (sabre) helped England to victory in the 5 Nations Competition held in Edinburgh at the end of last year.

The swimmers continue to have great success. Kunmi Ogunfeibo (LVIth) took part in the Catalonian Championships in Barcelona. He won bronze medals in the 100m and 50m backstroke and helped the London team take bronze in the 4 x 100m Medley Relay. Kunmi's next target is the Commonwealth Games trials in Glasgow. The U12 and U13 teams took 11 out of 12 titles at the Croydon Schools Championships; they also won the Trinity Group Gala. The U11 team won the Surrey Primary Schools freestyle and medley relay titles at Guildford Spectrum. At the Surrey Individual Championships Whitgift swimmers took 5 Gold, 4 Silver and 2 Bronze medals.

In football the U13s have progressed to the final of the ISFA Cup and will play Chigwell at Burton Albion FC in March. The U16s have reached the Semi-finals of the ESFA Cup. Bertrand Traore (OW, left 2013), a Burkina Faso international, signed for Chelsea and is now on loan to Vitesse Arnhem in Holland.

The Badminton team won both the U14 and U16 Croydon Schools' Championship and the Skiers picked up a Silver medal in the Team Slalom and a Bronze in the Team Dual Slalom at the Independent Schools' Championships held at Les Deux Alpes.

There are many exchanges and trips taking place over half-term to Zaragoza, Albertville, Toledo, Paris and Valle D'Aosta. Let's hope the weather improves during the second half of term.



We are proud to announce that our inaugural Award will be presented to Lt Colonel James Coates, OBE, who attended Whitgift School from 1981-88 and was chosen by *'The Daily Telegraph'* as one of their top ten 'Britons of the Year' in 2011.

James has enjoyed an action-packed and distinguished career in the Parachute Regiment, culminating in his command of the 3rd Para Battallion in Helmand Province. He introduced a new tactic, subsequently named the "Precision Strike", combining high-level intelligence, CCTV camera surveillance and the use of precision missile attacks.

James has been widely praised for devising and implementing the strategy and setting the benchmark in Afghanistan as the exemplar in exploiting the emerging surveillance technology resulting in him becoming known as "Scourge of the Taliban". Since returning to the UK, James has been a regular visitor to the School and a great supporter of the CCF.

He is currently working at the Cabinet Office consulting directly with 10 Downing Street on all matters relating to military strategy and the deployment of service personnel across the globe.

Operation Remembrance

2014 marks the centenary of the outbreak of World War I, during which 40 players of the OWRFC lost their lives. For some time we have been discussing how best to pay tribute to their ultimate sacrifice.

After much research we have tracked down graves and memorial sites of all 40 and have come to the conclusion that the most appropriate way to honour these men is to visit as many as possible and pay our respects. This is quite an undertaking with the biggest focus being placed on Northern France/Belgium where 31 of our fallen lie. A group of OWRFC members will be making this journey over the first weekend in July, departing from Croham Road on Friday 4th and returning on Monday 7th.

Boxing Day Rugby Success

On 26th December 1913 Old Whitgiftians' RFC played against Old Alleynians' RFC in the first of many Boxing Day fixtures. 100 years on, the latest episode was fought out at a sunny Dulwich.

The first half saw OAs exerting pressure on the OWs but the OWs were equal to the task. Fringe defence around rucks was solid, messrs Coleman, Murray, Hall, Oliveira, Weller and the Petschi brothers all putting in crunching tackles and doing their best to slow down OA's momentum. The centre partnership of Daly and Gunni/King, with the youngest in the line of the Morrison brothers (Ben) at 10, continued to repel the hard running OA backs. The first half ended with honours finishing even at 3-3 (the OW's



penalty converted courtesy of Ben Morrison).

The 2nd half was there for the taking, with vital contributions made by the fresh legs of Sullivan and Joyce and a welcome cameo from Tom Morrison (despite claiming to be only good for bucket and sponge duties). There was an embarrassment of riches, in the backs, with Pelling and Byrne continuing their excellent 1st XV form supplemented by Dr Anomelechi, the young Persaud-Walters and new club member Bruce Carter. Jon Eynon made a valuable contribution at 9, sharing scrum-half duties with old timer Dracoulis.

Outside centre Gunni scored the OW's first try followed by a penalty by Morrison. The OAs gained a quick try in reply putting the match in balance. The last 20 minutes highlighted the OW's determination to win and no. 8 Murray surged over to score. A further penalty put the score line at 21-10 with 10 minutes to go. The OWs held out with some in the pack hitting harder as the match wore on: particularly Blok, Ryan, Riches, Lee and Plinston.

The centenary fixture ended with a 27-10 win to the OWs. Man of the match was Cameron Petschi, back of the match was Miles Daly and forward of the match was Charlie Petschi. Thanks go to the very committed squad consisting of Coleman, Joyce, Ryan, Riches, Weller, Murray, Hall, Petschi (Cameron), Petschi (Charlie), Blok, Plinston, Sullivan, Lee, Oliveira, Pelling, Byrne, King, Eynon, Daly, Gunni, Anomelechi, Persaud-Walters, Carter and Dracoulis (capt.).
