



# Whitgift Veterans' Rifles

Despite a half decent March, a cold and windy day marked the start of the Veterans' Full Bore season with the annual Practice Shoot at Bisley on Saturday 28th March. Not the ideal conditions but a testing challenge nonetheless! This year's well attended shoot comprised ten members and one guest with some 30 details fired from 600 yards (see image) throughout the day. It was noted by Graham Clark (Full Bore Captain), "Out of the ten members shooting, nine had their own rifles. Quite a change from the old days," and very much indicative of the interest and enthusiasm of those taking part.

The first of our regular full bore matches at Bisley - the LMRA League Round 1 - took place on 19<sup>th</sup> April and comprised shoots at 300x and 500x for which we entered one team of six. No results for the match are available at the time of drafting this report.

Three further matches in May: namely the LMRA Schools Veterans event over 300x and 600x for which we are entering two teams on 2<sup>nd</sup> May; the Surrey Veterans match on 16<sup>th</sup> May for which we also hope to enter two teams; and the LMRA League Round 2 on 17<sup>th</sup> May for which we will enter one team of six as per Round 1. The final round of the LMRA League (Round 3), the Long Range contest will take place on 7<sup>th</sup> June.

In mid-March, we held our AGM at the Whitgift Sports Club, as usual a well-attended and positive event, with a mix of admin, discussion and trophy presentations. Two points worthy of mention here, namely, the appointment of Rob Beere as our new Honorary Treasurer. Good luck Rob with the combined dark arts of Double Entry Book-Keeping and Spreadsheets, and secondly the rather sobering fact that half of the Committee are over 70 years of age... watch this space!

We are now at the start of the summer Small Bore competition for which we have entered one small team of five, in the Surrey County Small Bore Rifle Association league. A gradual influx of new members will hopefully enable us to return to entering two teams when these new shots gain more experience.

In the 2014/2015 Winter League, our A Team are currently 2nd in their division with the last few results awaited.

The Whitgift School Rifle Club is now firmly established with a core membership under the keen management of staff member Peter [PJ] Morrison. With two shooting sessions a week, the boys are now consolidating their shooting development and producing some very promising young shots. Gates and Carmody-Firth, the first pair, then won on the 18<sup>th</sup> hole, but unfortunately, despite reducing a three-hole deficit to one hole at the 12th, and

coming within millimetres of levelling their match on the next two holes, Hedges and Beck were ultimately unable to repeat the heroics of 2014. Rugby went through.

Disappointing, but it was good to see three students in the team of ten, and with more to come out of the school's academy, the feeling persists that 'we will win this one day'!

The only other news in the period is that the AGM and annual dinner were held at the school in March, and Tony Harris has taken over from Mike Berners-Price as society captain.

#### **News from the School**

Another full and action-packed term at Whitgift finally came to an end this year on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> April... yes, that's right... this year we worked right up to Good Friday! Whilst most other schools in the country had been making the most of their holidays for the previous one or two weeks, Whitgift boys and staff were working right up to the wire. And why not? Whitgift is a school that packs in so much that conventional term dates are just not good enough.

Early on in March, Performing Arts quite literally took centre stage in the Whitgift calendar, with Big School housing a week of performances of Arthur Miller's 'The Crucible'. Performed in the round and utilizing a cast of Upper School pupils, in conjunction with girls from Old Palace of John Whitgift School, the play was a triumph. Set against the intentionallysparse stage design, the strength of the characters shone through, particularly Pavan Rao's superb rendition of John Proctor, Rebekah Elliott's loyal Elizabeth Proctor, and Charlotte Boris's conniving Abigail Williams. The courtroom scenes had the audience entranced, with gripping performances by Abbas Khan (Deputy Governor Danforth), Aaron Bird (Reverend Hale), and Alexandre King (Judge Hathorne), playing the austere and righteous officials, offset with the girls' convincing displays of hysteria.



The incredible success of the school's hockey teams has already been extensively reported upon in these pages, and so it will come as somewhat of a shock to hear that the First Eleven went crashing out of the National Outdoor Cup at the Quarter Final stage, losing 1-0 to Hurstpierpoint. It was the team's only loss to school opposition during the term, but that is what Cup sport is all about, and I am sure that the boys will have learnt a valuable lesson

from defeat. Elsewhere, the hockey juggernaut rolls on, with the U13s, 14s and 16s all reaching their respective National Finals.

Whitgift's U13 footballers achieved the outstanding feat of winning the Investec ISFA Cup for the fifth consecutive year, beating City of London Freeman School for Boys 4-0 in the final, on 5<sup>th</sup> March. Their incredible run in this national



competition is summed up glowingly by their coach, and former professional footballer, Mr Andrew Martin, "Over the five years Whitgift have participated in the tournament, they have played 29 games, won 29, lost 0, scored 178 goals, and conceded 13 - an incredible schoolboy achievement that is unlikely to be repeated anytime soon. The boys have been outstanding, showing a real belief in their ability. They were fantastic on the day, playing some great football and scoring four superb goals. They have played to their billing as favourites for the title, with stylish, attacking football. Well done to the boys and let's hope next year's crop can carry on the success." Upper Third pupil, Callum Hudson-Odoi, who scored a hat-trick when he played in last year's final, has been selected for England U15s in the Tournament Delle Nazioni, Italy at end April. England will play Italy, Egypt and Japan in their group.

In other sports news, the success story of the Rugby 7s season was the U13 side, who won the prestigious Berkhamsted tournament and were runners up at the Rosslyn Park national event. There were top performances from Whitgift at the 2015 British Schools Modern Biathlon Championships, which took place at the end of March. With 700 boys competing across the age groups, Whitgift had 30 boys representing the School at the Olympic Park. There were three team podium finishes: U12 Gold; U14 Silver; U15 Bronze, and First Former, Rowan Fuss managed to win the U12 individual gold award, which means he is well on the way to matching current OWs, Joe Choong, Tom Lees, Sam Curry and

James Myatt, who have all recently represented Great Britain in senior internationals, in their continuing bids for Rio qualification. In the National Fencing championships, the school achieved its traditional success, with the U14 team being crowned British Overall Champions across all three weapons and, on an individual level, Tarriq Roach winning the gold medal in the Epee event (out of 97 entrants) and Connor Head attaining the silver medal in the Master at Arms event. Lastly with regard to sport, Third Form pupil, James Smith, has been selected by Table Tennis England to play in the Cadet Home 6 Nations competition, due to take place in Cardiff, from 13-15<sup>th</sup> March 2015. James has been a part of the Youth Squad since September, a setup geared to 'help the elite players of the future hit their full potential'.

Whilst sport often dominates the headlines in Whitgift life, the last two weeks of term saw other areas of the school occupy the limelight. For the past three years, a group of Year 9 boys, under the expert guidance of former BBC employee and now a pillar of the English department, Mrs Kate Goldberg, have taken part in the BBC News School Report day, working to a 1pm deadline to compile and then broadcast a news segment that is then transmitted across the nation. This year's broadcast took place on 19th March. (The boys' efforts can be viewed on the school website.)



The end of term was spectacularly ushered in with the hugely enjoyable Royal Festival Hall concert, which featured a programme involving multiple musicians and the entire First Form! Many OWs attended the concert, including Stranack, Lindblom, Warren, Flanagan, Blundell, Wilkinson, Woodrow, Proudfoot, many of whom are Past Presidents of the Association.

We look forward to trying to further that success next season.


