News from the School

Whitgift has long been known as an innovative school, so it is no surprise that innovation is a theme that runs through this report. Starting with something close to my heart: the House system has adopted a new structure whereby all the events for a single year group take place on a single lunchtime. Given the current size of the school, on any given Tuesday or Thursday lunchtime, up to 220 boys partake in activities to inch their House further up the table. Some things never change, however: Mason's were still at the top of the league come half term!

An impressive line-up of children's authors have visited recently including Alex Scarrow, Eoin Colfer and most recently, BREIS, who, as well as being a writer, is also a dynamic hip-hop and rap artist. The boys enjoyed his lilting, lyrical logic and got the opportunity to 'bust a rhyme' and 'flex' themselves. (How's that for keeping up with the kids?) To build on this momentum, the inaugural Junior English Festival (described as "Just like the Hay Festival, only better") takes place on 21st November.

On 10th October, the school was privileged to present an evening of music and entertainment from the hit television series, The Darling Buds of May (*see page 3*) featuring the Whitgift Chamber Orchestra, and members of the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra. This was, indeed, a fabulous evening, made all the more special by the fact it was hosted by WA Chairman, Pip Burley, who composed the music and produced the original show. The department's next showpiece is the traditional Autumn Collection concert at Fairfield Halls on 20th November.

Not to be outdone, the Drama Department has shown the capacity to step outside of its comfort zone competing in the 2014 Hispanic Theatre Festival, hosted at North London Collegiate School, in Harrow, on 1st October. Six Whitgift students represented Whitgift against other top independent schools, such as Eton, Harrow, St Paul's and University College School. Whitgift performed the gripping play La Muerte y La Doncella by the famous Chilean writer, Ariel Dorfman, and won the grand prize of 'Best Group - Spoken Spanish'. The Sixth Form play this year, Trapped, was performed in Big School on 14th and 15th October. The performances were mesmerising and by the time the show

was over, Big School had never felt so small! The Upper school play this term is Oscar Wilde's, "The Importance of Being Earnest", and will be performed in Big School from 10th to 12th December.

Thirty of Whitgift's Combined Cadet Force travelled to the Tower of London, on 28th

September, to take part in their 'Poppies in the Moat' project (pictured above). The art installation transformed the dry moat into a powerful visual commemoration for the First World War Centenary. The venture displays 888,246 ceramic poppies, each representing a Great War fatality. The Whitgift boys were part of a volunteer team that planted a staggering 9,000 poppies during the afternoon, an apt undertaking that honours the 248 Whitgiftians lost during the War.

The school has enjoyed a phenomenal run of sports successes but before I feedback on the main sports, here is a taster of achievements in other sports:

- The U15 cricket team were crowned National T20 Champions.
- Upper third former, James Smith, was selected for the England Youth Squad in table tennis.
- Harvey Byers made his debut for the England U16 Golf team in a match against Wales. George Mullins also represented England, playing for the U18 team in Spain.
- In the Modern Pentathlon programme, one of the School's newest sports, no less than three medals were won in the British Tetrathlon Championships. The school was awarded Academy Status by Pentathlon GB, the national governing body for Modern Pentathlon. The department celebrated its 10-year anniversary in September, with a reception attended by the Headmaster, coaching staff past and present, Senior Modern Pentathlon boys and a number of Old Whitgiftians who are currently making great strides in the sport at the very top level.

The Rugby First Fifteen got their season off to an incredible start by defeating a



formidable Sedbergh team who had recently returned unbeaten from a tour to South Africa. This result started a run of wins that was only halted by two narrow defeats to Wellington and Warwick. The team got back on track, however, by pounding old rivals, John Fisher, 38-10, in front of another bumper crowd on Bigside, who enjoyed supporting the team by belting out verses of Carmen in an awesome display of school spirit.

The Hockey First Eleven have recently enjoyed even more success than their rugby counterparts! Having trounced the very best - an 8-0 victory over Millfield here, a 5-1 win over Kingston there - they went looking further afield for someone to challenge them and decided to take on Universities. The result? More of the same: a 4-2 win over Oxford and a 4-1 win over Christ Church Canterbury. This success has been matched on an individual level by players such as Rhys Smith, who made his East Grinstead Hockey debut in September, even though he is still a Sixth Former, and OWs Luke Taylor, Rob Farrington and Jonty Griffiths, who were selected to play for England U21s in the Sultan of Johor Cup, in Malaysia, from 12th-19th October.

I have left the most endearing and encouraging news to the end: Football – another relatively new sport in Whitgift's rich history – has gone from strength to strength in recent years and all age group teams are currently progressing well through the early rounds of their national competitions. The U11 side have already found their way into the national finals of the ISFA competition! That's right: before they know their Puntabout from their Big School, they are already representing Whitigft in a national final! The future is bright; the future is Whitgift!


