A shorter than usual report this time as I lack the more specific data that I normally have for the FB competitions. . .however:On 14 April we shot the first of three rounds in the LMRA League over $300 \& 500$ yards: finishing in 3rd place.
Some weeks later the Vets. Entered two teams in the LMRA.

PSV Match over 300 \& 600 yards. First shot in 1978 having been instigated - and the winner's trophy provided - by the WVRC. The winners - as usual - were Old Epsomians, no surprises there!
Our leading scorers were Adrian Oliver and Ian Todd with 92.1 and 92.7, respectively. The Surrey PSV was shot on 18 May likewise at $300 \& 600$ yards: sadly I do not have results for this event [ Surrey RA website yet again et al!] but doubtless the OEs - as above - will have featured!
The following day the Vets competed in the 2nd round of the LMRA League, over the familiar 300 \& 600 yards. This time finishing in 2nd place.
The third and final round of the LMRA League took place on 9 June, over 900 \& 1000 yards. We again finished the day in 2nd place, with a final ranking of 2nd place on aggregate over the three rounds, behind Lloyds TSB and beating East Barnet and Old Haberdashers. Last year we finished in 3rd place on aggregate, so well done all.
All credit and thanks to those members who have represented the Vets. so well and who have also made some very early morning starts to several of these Bisley matches.
Namely, Messrs. Graham Clark, Justin Coo, Jack Furtado, Nick Harman, Simon Lacey, Paul Nalson, Adrian Oliver, IanTodd, JohnTwyford and David Westnedge.
Our final Bisley competition of the season is the National Rifle Association PSV, to be held on the afternoon of Thursday 11 July with one shoot at 500 yards. We are entering 3 teams of 5 as per most years. This event will be followed by the annual informal dinner at the Artists Rifles club house, bringing our annual FB competition calendar to a conclusion.
The Whitgift Rifle Club [aka the Junior Section of the WVRC] maintains its momentum under the excellent leadership of staff member Peter Morrison, with some assistance from the Vets. At the moment however, exams etc. are affecting the weekly Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon shoots for the obvious reasons.
New equipment, namely slings, gloves and the latest design in shooting jackets are about to arrive and will enable the boys to move up a gear in their shooting experience and technique when the new term starts.
This time last year we were celebrating our Small Bore ' A ' Team's victory in the Forsyth Trophy against the winners of the other 6 divisions of the 2012 Summer League!
Sadly the performance of both our A and B teams in the Winter League that followed is best forgotten and we can but hope for greater success in this Summer's matches of which 4 ex 10 rounds have so far been shot....watch this space.
Like all clubs and societies, the Vets' longevity [117 years] and continuance relies on a loyal and supportive membership, but as both anno domini and circumstances inevitably dictate, we need to encourage new members to our sport other than current pupils. Early mention should be made of the Autumn Meeting. There will be a choice of the West course at Ashdown, for those who do not want to tackle the carries on the Old Course, and the entry fee will be very reasonable. The society is keen to attract new, and especially younger, members and with this in mind, is offering to subsidise the green fees of any potential new member under 35 at this event. England bowler Jimmy Anderson would be pleased with figures showing 2 for 5 after 11. At the Captain's Day meeting in April, namesake Don (Don 'Toofer' Anderson) could be equally proud after he pitched in from 100 yards to earn himself an eagle two at Tandridge's 11th, and five stableford points. Certainly it stunned his playing partners into silence after they had ribbed him for walking forward to survey the hole position before his shot. Possibly they should have realised by then that this was going to be a special round; the eagle left Don only one over par at that stage. He went on to score 46 points, romping to victory over schoolmaster Simon Beck, who scored an impressive 40 points himself, and 12 year old schoolboy George Kemp, 34 points. All very impressive, especially for the 18 other entrants, who trailed in behind. A number of our regular society members were unable to attend the event as it coincided with Gerry Bowthorpe's funeral. Gerry was a very popular and respected member of the Society and we paused to honour and remember Gerry during the evening
Grafton Morrish captain Nic Gates reports below on a successful qualifying round at Royal Wimbledon. Congratulations to the team.
The competition for qualification to the finals of the Grafton Morrish took place at Royal Wimbledon on the afternoon of Sunday 12th of May. There was a relatively stiff breeze and a few showers, and as a consequence the course was playing harder than usual. The format of the competition was foursomes scratch stableford, with 3 pairs playing for each school. There were 18 schools competing, with the top 7 combined scores qualifying for the finals in Norfolk in September.
Whitgift were paired with Highgate and St Georges, Weybridge. The first pair of Alex Atkinson and Nicolas Gates had a frustrating finish of two bogies but still finished with a relatively strong score of 28 points. Our second pair of Martin Hayes and Matt Dawton had a splendid finish with 4 birdies in their last 6 holes giving them a total of 35 points, just one over par and the highest score of the day. Our third pair of Peter Blok and Martin Down both very kindly volunteered to represent the school at the last minute and in the conditions scored a very respectable 17 points, bringing our total for the day to 80 points, which placed us 3rd, comfortably qualifying for the finals.
The lamb shank at Shirley Park (30 May) was cooked for four hours at 150 degrees, and was delicious. The golf in the match vs OMWs took just as long, but the play was probably not quite to the same standard, and certainly the temperature, in what passed for a British summer's day, was not as high. However, the result, two wins and two halves for a 3-1 win, was satisfying and the OWs hold the trophy for another year. All very enjoyable.
Lastly in this edition, a word on the evening meeting at Cuddington (13 June). Twenty three took to the fairways (and beyond!), but of course there can only be one winner. In the event it was our immediate past captain John Gould (photo below) who emerged on top, and won the Hornsey Walker trophy. A popular winner, John scored 39 points, thanks to a
back nine including seven pars and an impressive number of single putts. The last time John's name appeared on the trophy was in 1951! A different John Gould though.
In the Veteran's Cup, played for in the same competition, there WAS more than one winner. This cup is awarded for the best score by those aged over 60 (but the winner of the Hornsey Walker cannot also win this one). First Peter Kelley was awarded the trophy for his 32 points, shortly before it became apparent that in fact it should have been presented to new member John Grima ( 36 pts), who is clearly older than he looks. Also to be congratulated is Alan Blok who came second in the overall competition, also with 36 pts, but is of such tender years that a trophy eluded him, even temporarily.

## NEWS FROM THE SCHOOL - Phil Fladgate

This has been another very busy term with many varied activities going on. UVIth former Akshay Garigiparthy was in the news; his final year Design Technology project now takes pride of place at Taplow Court, home of the Soka Gakkai International UK (a lay Buddhist Society). He designed and created the 'Lotus of Gratitude'; the lotus is installed in a Japanese Water Garden and rests on the water's surface it has LEDs that reflect off its petals. He is now producing one for the school.
There was a very successful CCF Annual General Inspection in early May; Lt-Col Mike Cornwall (OW) was the Inspecting Officer. Lt-Col. Keith Smith, Contingent Commander Whitgift CCF, was awarded the MBE for services to the CCF in the Queen's Birthday Honours.
The UVIth Form Graduation took place on 21st June; Lt-Col. James Coates OBE (OW) was the guest of honour. The UVIth Form Leavers' Ball then took place in the Sports and Conference Centre.
There has been continued success in many different sports this term. In Fencing Tamiz Roach won the British U12 Youth Championships. Kunmi Ogunfeibo has been selected to represent the England Schools Swimming team in the ISF World Schools Games in Brazil; he will be swimming in the 50 m and 100 m Backstroke. The U12, U13 and U14 teams all won London Schools titles in the meet at St Pauls. The athletes have been having a good season; the U12s won the Croydon Schools Championships, the U14s won the Trinity Group title and the U15s have qualified for the ESAA National Finals at Gateshead. Sid Holland threw a new school record in the Hammer (32.60m). At the Surrey Schools Championships Stefan Amokwondoh won the U17 Triple Jump, Ocean Schwartz won the U17 High Jump with a new school record (1.90m), Ben Deuchar won the U15 Javelin and Will Varcoe won the 80 m Hurdles.
Golfer George Mullins won the Surrey Senior Order of Merit; this is a competition involving the best amateur golfers in Surrey.
Henry Choong has continued to have success in Modern Pentathlon; he was part of the three man GB team that took the Bronze medal at the European Championships.
The cricket season has been going well, although, yet again there has been considerable disruption of fixtures due to the weather. The U13s have reached the semi-final of the Bunbury National Cup and the U15s have reached the quarter-final stage in the Surrey Cup. The 1st XI has had some impressive wins and two VIth Formers, Dominic Sibley (LVIth) and Jack

Winslade (UVIth) made their first-class debuts for Surrey CCC against Oxford MCCU in May. The Surrey team also contained three other OWs (Rory Burns, Mike Burgess and Jason Roy, who captained the side). Freddie Van Den Bergh (OW) scored a hundred for Durham MCCU against Derbyshire going in at number 9 !
On the rugby front two OWs have been in the news. Marland Yarde was selected for the England tour to Argentina; he played against the Barbarians at Twickenham and scored and then made his England debut in the second test against Argentina, scoring two tries in an emphatic England win. Elliot Daly was selected to play for the Barbarians against England; he scored a longrange try in this game and then went with the Barbarians to Hong Kong to play against the Lions. He kicked a penalty in this match.
The School 1st XV embark on a major tour in July and August, taking in Hong Kong, New Zealand and the Cook Islands.
The Trinity term will be brought to an end with the Lower School musical 'Bugsy Malone' and a recital by Remus Azoitei and pianist Eduard Stan to celebrate the International Music Competition. The term ends with the Celebration of Whitgift Life on 5th July. Finally, the Boarding House is now in operation and has 10 boarders in it; there will be over 60 next term!
