HRH The Duke of York officially opened the new boarding house, Founder's House, on 16th October. The Duke unveiled a statue of John Whitgift (pictured above), sculpted by Sam Holland, which is positioned at the front of the boarding house.

The first seven weeks of term have flown by with the amount of activities and opportunities on offer to boys increasing every year. This half-term there are exchanges to Hamburg, Berlin, Valencia, Beijing and Verona; there is a Classics trip to Rome and Pompeii, an International Baccalaureate trip to Paris and a Surf Safari to Portugal. The History and Politics Department is taking two trips, one to the USA (Washington, New York and Gettysburg) and one to Berlin. The 1st XI Hockey team is going on a tour to Holland and the Golfers to a tournament in Spain. The RAF Section of the CCF has a Flying Trip to RAF Benson and the Army Section has a Training Camp at Folkestone.

Success on the sports front has continued in many different areas. The highlight being the batting of Dominic Sibley UVIth (pictured overleaf with OW Test Cricketer Raman Subba Row), who in his third first-class match for Surrey, became the youngest double centurion in the history of County Championship cricket. His 242 (eventually bowled by Ryan Sidebottom) against Yorkshire, was a real marathon lasting one minute short of ten hours during which time he broke several records: He became Surrey's youngest

centurion, the 2nd youngest double centurion in first-class cricket in England after W.G. Grace and the 13th youngest double centurion in the world. He will be playing for England U19 alongside Jack Winslade (OW) this winter.

The swimmers have made a successful start to the season, at the South-East Divisional Relay Championships the U18s won both the Medley and Freestyle events, the U16s were Runners-up in the Freestyle, and the U14s and U12s both won their Medley and Freestyle events – a remarkable effort!


The dinner concluded with a vote of thanks to John Humphries for his excellent organisation resulting in a well attended and enjoyable event.

First World War OW Memorial Plaque

The first charge on the OWA War Memorial Trust Fund is to remember the Fallen, so when John Nalson discovered that there was no Whitgift Memorial in the St George's Church at Ypres the OWTL sprang into action. The Headmaster gave his blessing and negotiations were started with the Belgian authorities and the WW1 OW Book of Remembrance was scrutinized for details. The final wording was agreed and the Plaque commissioned and mounted on display in the Church and to complete the process a short dedication service was held on Sunday evening 30th June 2013 to coincide with the School's U3rd form history visit.

Afterwards two memorial wreaths were laid at the Menin Gate during the nightly Last Post ceremony on behalf of the School and the Old Whitgiftians. A second plaque has been mounted at the School in South Entrance, together with the other OW memorials to the Fallen, and will be dedicated during the Remembrance Service on Monday 11th November 2013 at 11.00am
